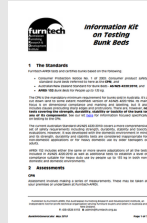


# BUNK BED STANDARDS



## GUIDANCE FOR BUNK BED STANDARDS IN AUSTRALIA....

### AFRDI Standard 152: Bunk Beds for People up to 135 kg.

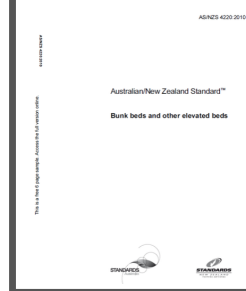


A new standard has been developed to allow manufacturers to have bunks weight load tested. **This is not mandatory.** The aim is to provide a standard suitable for almost any bunk bed application - including for people up to 135 kg in either severe domestic or commercial environments.

### AS\_NZS 4220\_2010 \_ Bunk beds and other elevated beds

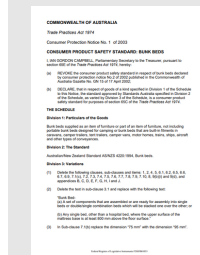


The FULL STANDARD provides guidance to designers and manufacturers of bunks over and above that which is required by the CPN. This is important as the CPN is mostly concerned with domestic use. Meeting the full standard ensures that bunks are adequate for more robust use as experienced in accommodation facilities.

### Consumer Protection Notice No. 1 of 2003 CONSUMER PRODUCT SAFETY STANDARD: BUNK BEDS



The Consumer Protection Notice lays out the minimum mandatory requirements of **AS\_NZS 4220\_2010 \_ Bunk beds and other elevated beds** that must be met by designers and manufacturers of bunk beds to be sold in Australia. All bunks must carry at least the orange tick certification.
