Position Description ICDC Trainer

About the ICDC

The ICDC is a signature training program delivered by a team of volunteer trainers, through the Australian Camps Association under the auspice of the International Camping Fellowship (ICF). The Australian program has been delivered 12 times since 2009 and has earned a reputation for quality facilitation and industry relevance.

Approximately 180 camp professionals have completed the Australian course to-date.

Becoming an ICDC Trainer

Certification of ICDC Trainers is controlled internationally through the ICF ICDC Coordinator, Connie Coutellier. ICDC Train the Trainer programs are generally held alongside an ICDC course being held in conjunction with either the International Camping Congress or other approved ICDC events.

Entry into a TTT program is conditional on:

- Application to ICF
- Nomination/support by the Australian Camps Association
- Previous participant/completion of an Australian or International ICDC.

TTT participants are expected to meet the cost of course enrolment plus transport.

Role Responsibilities

As a member of Australian ICDC team you will:

- Be available to join a training team at least once every two years, depending on your level of qualification/certification from ICF (e.g. Assistant Trainer, Trainer or Lead Trainer).
- Work collaboratively with your ICDC colleagues and the ACA between courses to update content and support resources.
- Role model the values of the Australian Camps Association, International Camping Fellowship and ICDC.
- Advocate the value of the International Camp Directors Course.

Required Skills, Experience and Attributes

- Previous completion of an Australian or international ICDC,
- Proven extensive experience in residential campsite management (including experience above middle management),
- Strong understanding of the regulatory environment within which campsites operate,
- Demonstrated industry engagement and participation,
- Experience and/or qualification as a facilitator of adult learning,
- A passion for the benefits of the residential camp experience,
- Ability to work collaboratively,
- Capacity to look at the challenges and develop solutions that improve delivery for the ICDC.
