CIRCULAR TO PARISH PRIESTS AND PRINCIPALS OF CATHOLIC SCHOOLS IN THE ARCHDIOCESE OF MELBOURNE AND LEADERS OF RELIGIOUS CONGREGATIONS

Overnight Accommodation at Residential Campsites

MAIN POINTS

- Schools using residential campsites for overnight accommodation are advised to use accredited venues.
 - Lists of accredited campsites can be found at these links:
 - <u>ATAP</u> (Australian Tourism Accreditation Program) Camp and/or Adventure Activity Accreditation (select Accredited Camp and Adventure Activity Provider under business type).
 - <u>NARTA</u> (National Accommodation Recreation Tourism Accreditation) Accredited Camps.
- Residential campsites are purpose-designed sites that have permanent facilities such as dormitory accommodation, kitchen, showers, toilets and adventure recreation options. Residential campsites do not include Victorian government residential schools or accommodation-only venues such as caravan parks, hotels/motels or ski lodges.
- Schools are advised to have appropriate procedures in place for managing offsite activities including logging on the Catholic schools <u>Student Activity Locator</u> (SAL) on the CEVN website <u>http://cevn.cecv.catholic.edu.au</u> under *Emergency Management / Student Activity Locator* at least three weeks prior to any planned camp or excursion.

ACTIONS REQUIRED

- Schools must ensure residential campsites used for overnight accommodation are accredited with a government-recognised accreditation provider.
- Schools must complete the Catholic schools online <u>Student Activity Locator</u> (SAL) on the <u>CEVN website</u> at least three weeks prior to any approved camp or excursion.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

- School-owned or controlled residential campsites must be accredited with <u>ATAP</u> or <u>NARTA</u>, if the school uses it for overnight camps.
- Some tourism programs accredited by ATAP do not cover accreditation for Camp and/or Adventure Activities. Schools will need to ensure that these sites are also appropriately accredited for these activities.
